
Jacksonville Weather Information

FLOTILLA STAFF REPORTS - PREVENTION

<u>PUBLIC EDUCATION – BOB STRONG</u>



We had nine students signed up for our About Boating Safely (ABS) course on 13 August. One family of 3 cancelled at the last minute and 1 student was a no-show. We had 5 very interested students complete this course. One student scored 100% correct on the final examination. Paul Burns, John Hadley and Bruce Ennis did a great job helping to teach it.

During the Navigation chapter 3, I used the example of forming the bow of a vessel with my hands and arms and asking what lights the students should see depending on which way I turned. At the time, I thought I was not connecting with the students and dropped

it. However, in the student evaluation, two stated I should have gotten all the students on their feet to participate, rather than just assuming they could visualize which light they would be seeing. They went on to say they needed some lights or colored cards to hold for the others to see. This got me thinking that we need some training aids. Is anyone interested in building any? For example, I do have a partially completed wooden stick model of a 42' Chris Craft boat that needs to be finished. The hull frame is complete and it measures 48" in length. It could be completed with lights and all and used in our course. Do we have any model boat builders in the flotilla?

We had 3 students attend and complete our course on 27 August. Bruce Ennis and John Hadley did a great job helping teach this course.

Our next and final ABS course for 2011 is on 15 October at the Stellar building. Paul Burns will be out of town. If you had ever planned to step up and help with our PE program now is your chance. I need another instructor and at least one or more aides to help.

MARINE SAFETY - KYLE GEORGE



Hurricane and emergency preparedness list and kit all homes should have ready... stay safe and prepared. "Chance favors the prepared mind".

- Water at least 1 gallon daily per person for 3 to 7 days
- Food at least enough for 3 to 7 days —non-perishable packaged or canned food
 / juices —foods for infants or the elderly —snack foods —non-electric can opener —cooking tools / fuel —paper plates / plastic utensils
- Blankets / Pillows, etc.
- Clothing seasonal / rain gear/ sturdy shoes
- First Aid Kit / Medicines / Prescription Drugs
- Special Items for babies and the elderly
- Toiletries / Hygiene items / Moisture wipes
- Flashlight / Batteries
- Radio Battery operated and NOAA weather radio
- Telephones Fully charged cell phone with extra battery and a traditional (not cordless) telephone set
- Cash (with some small bills) and Credit Cards Banks and ATMs may not be available for extended periods
- Keys
- Toys, Books and Games
- Important documents in a waterproof container or watertight resealable plastic bag —insurance, medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card, etc.
- Tools keep a set with you during the storm
- Vehicle fuel tanks filled
- Pet care items —proper identification / immunization records / medications / ample supply of food and water / a carrier or cage / muzzle and leash

For all my gun owners please have any documentation of ownership and eligibility for your state. Do not ever leave guns or ammunition where children or other "incompetent" people can get to them. This is a felony in most states.

# **United States Coast Guard Auxiliary Update The Jacksonville Flotilla's Origins and Purpose**

The Mandarin-based flotilla has a colorful history and it has spawned other Jacksonvillearea flotillas, including the newest in Green Cove Springs. This month, I'll share the flotilla's origins and purpose as compiled by our Historian, Carolyn Strong and other long-time members.

Boating always has been one of America's favorite pastimes. Due to several events in the early years of the 20th century, the number of recreational boaters skyrocketed. At present, the Jacksonville area harbors over 40,000 registered recreational boats.

Congress passed legislation in 1939 which established the Coast Guard Reserve, a volunteer civilian component, to promote boating safety and facilitate the operations of the Coast Guard. Groups of boat owners were organized into flotillas and these into divisions within Coast Guard Districts around the country. In February 1941, a military Reserve was created and the civilian volunteer organization was renamed the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary. During World War II recruits flooded into Auxiliary flotillas in a burst of patriotic fervor. As their ranks grew, thousands of active duty Coast Guard personnel were freed up for service overseas. We know that by 1942 there was an active Coast Guard Auxiliary flotilla in the Jacksonville area.

However, it was in 1969, that ten members of the Florida Tackle and Gun Club on San Jose Blvd decided to join the Coast Guard Auxiliary and form their own flotilla in Jacksonville, becoming chartered on 19 April 1969. Northeast Florida is currently divided into seven flotillas, covering the area from St. Mary's Georgia to Palatka, Florida. Two of these meet in Jacksonville and one at the Beaches.

Walter 'Andy' Anderson was the first Flotilla Commander. Andy was the boating editor for the Times Union newspaper and the leader of this chartering group of members. Membership rose and was near 60 Auxiliarists by 2010 when some members transferred to form the Green Cove Springs unit.

Besides our regular duties, members have participated in national events, including the G-8 Conference in May 2004 and the Super Bowl in February 2005. Thus far in 2011, one member attended a U.S. Coast Guard school and another was chosen for disaster service in tornado-stricken areas of Alabama partially due to his Auxiliary training.

This is our way. This is who we are. This is what we do.
