John was put to the test, as evidenced by his sweat soaked shirt, but at the end of the day he was doing just fine. Ted Schneider has asked John down to Palatka for several additional weekends in October to train for his QE audit for crew on October 27. Ted is a great human being and a fantastic teacher, and we owe him a debt of gratitude for

helping John get prepared. On October 13, our facility, *Carlie II*, was again on patrol, this time for a rowing race on the Arlington River. Kevin Koehl served as crew, and Whatley Law came along as a crew trainee. We joined with two facilities from 14-4, Marc Lang's "*Sentry*", and John Davis' "*Rapture*". This was a beautiful day to be on the river, and we got to meet and mingle with other Auxiliarists and some of the racers and race officials. This flotilla had an interesting month in October, and some of it went unnoticed. To bring everyone up to date, let us begin with RiverFest 2012. One of the two yearly public service events at NASJAX Mulberry Cove, this ends the official boating season. Manager Phil Collins included Flotilla 14-8, inviting us to staff a booth. While the booth size was minimal, Marlene Koehl along with new member Whatley Law did us well, garnering five vessel safety checks (VSCs). At the same time Whatley fulfilled his five required VSCs under supervision. He will soon be an officially qualified vessel

examiner. Congratulations Whatley!

Our mentoring program is proceeding. I have heard that some of the mentees are making appropriate progress. This is important both to their growth in the Coast Guard Auxiliary, and to Flotilla 14-8. While the gold side accomplishes much in their professional development, this <u>IS</u> their schedule. By contrast, we find ways to "git 'er done," and we must remember that is one of the things which makes all of us so valuable to the gold side.

Sometimes I find that getting members qualified is a trial. I want it as much as they, and am just as pleased as they are when a qualification is earned. But there are steps to go through, and recent policy can often trip me up. So - the lesson is this: an official Basically Qualified (BQ) designation is earned only after attending a class. Online classes are okayed state and other bodies, but the US Coast Guard has not sanctioned this, and for good reason: face-to-face instruction just plain works better, more is learned and the student benefits more.

Our guest lecture season was concluded with the appearance of Capt. Andy Andersen USN (RET.) who gave us all a few pointers in the living of our lives. This value-laced speech was definitely a pick-me-up. In my review of all the speakers we have had this year - and they all had something to teach us - Capt. Andy did a great deal to reinvigorate my thinking. So I wonder now: What do I do for an encore? I will be entertaining thoughts and ideas to pass on to my (potential) successor, as this speaker season has officially come to an end. November's meeting will feature my delivery of a required sexual harassment prevention training session, which is required for all members.

Reminders are in order that four members are slipping to REYR for their Instructor qualifications, and one for Boat crew. While the names will not be published here, notices have gone out to them. Another partner event is scheduled on 10 November at Sailor's Exchange, formerly Pier 17, located on Roosevelt Blvd. The Auxiliary will be staffing a boating safety table and promoting vessel safety checks at the partner's grand opening and flea market. The following is taken from the Recreational Boating Safety - Visitation Program (RBS-VP) Manual (COMDTINST M16796.3C) and are the words of Warren McAdams, National Directorate Commodore for Recreational Boating Safety, USCG Auxiliary. It offers a good description of RBS-VP for those of you unfamiliar with this Auxiliary mission.

"The goal of this program is to establish 'community partners' and to visit them on a regular basis. The primary purpose of the visit is to inform the program partner of the Coast Guard's Recreational Boating Safety program and the applicable federal, state and local safety requirements. While doing so, the program visitor has the opportunity to clarify safety issues, promote safe boating education and the Vessel Safety Check program. Where the 'community' partner is not a traditional marine business/dealership, the Program Visitor becomes a program resource and maintains a supply of safety related literature, federal and state requirement booklets, public education class schedules, and Vessel Safety Check station locations and schedules. We firmly believe that by educating the business establishments in the recreational boating safety community, we are leveraging our contact with the recreational boater. A knowledgeable program partner literally multiples our contact with and impact on our ultimate customers, the recreational boater. "



#### INFORMATION SYSTEMS – MARLENE KOEHL



Due to an early cut-off date this year, all mission reports for 2012 should be submitted by 15 December in order to be included in the final 2012 report run by the Auxiliary. If you have any unreported missions, i.e. vessel exams, program visits, instructor hours, patrols, etc., please submit them to me as soon as possible. Most certifications require a minimum number of hours or missions in order to maintain your certification.

Recently, we have started to see REYR status alerts being sent out to members who are in danger of not fulfilling their currency maintenance requirements. Each alert

indicated the deficiency. If you have received such a notice, you have until 15 December to fulfill the requirement and avoid your competency going into REYR status. With the end of the year approaching, it would be a good time to review and verify your personal information in AUXDATA so that everything is accurate and up to date for 2013. 



# United States Coast Guard Auxiliary Update Keeping Waterways Safe By Contributing Writer Kevin Koehl, Flotilla 14-8

Fall marks the official end of the boating season for much of the US, but for Florida boaters, it means the beginning of some of the best boating weather of the year. It also signals the start of the migration of many cruisers from Canada and our eastern states to Florida waterways for the fall, winter and spring months. Jacksonville, the St. Johns River and the Intracoastal Waterway play a major role in this migration.

Many seasonal boaters utilize St. Johns River marinas and boatyards in Jacksonville and Green Cove Springs for summer storage of their sailboats, cruisers, and trawlers. With hurricane season winding down, cruisers will make their way to the Florida coast, the Keys, and the Bahamas to take advantage of the warm weather, boater friendly coastal communities and great fishing. The Coast Guard and the Auxiliary play a vital role in this migration.

The Intracoastal Waterway or ICW, affectionately known by boaters as "the ditch", is the major route in the cruisers' migration. A combination of manmade and natural coastal waterways, the ICW's narrow channel is subject to shifting shoals, especially at inlets. The Coast Guard is responsible for placing and maintaining the waterway "road signs" or aids to navigation which mark the channel to keep boaters safe. The Coast Guard Auxiliary assists by regularly checking aids to navigation to identify damaged, weathered or missing markers. Boaters can also play a valuable role by reporting problems with aids to navigation or other navigation hazards to Coast Guard Sector Jacksonville at 904 564-7500. Imminent hazards to navigation can be reported to the Coast Guard on VHF Channel 16.

Boater education also plays a major role in safely navigating our waterways. You can learn how to identify and understand aids to navigation by attending a Coast Guard Auxiliary one day Boating Safety Class on Saturday, Nov 10 at 9010 San Jose Blvd. Contact Bob at 904 721-1346 for more information.

The missions of the Coast Guard and Auxiliary are critical year round to keep waterways safe for boaters navigating our Florida waterways.
